Getting immunized is still the most effective way to stay safe. While the peak of respiratory illness season has passed, the SARS CoV2 virus continues to circulate at lower levels in the community. The protection from infection that COVID-19 vaccines provide decreases over time, particularly in older people, so a spring COVID-19 vaccine booster will ensure people stay protected.
